I - an area 5m

I - 1974. A bank
of approx 50 cm left
between cut and Trial
trench I.

Stratigraphy

① "teora ripartata"
earth thrown up by
~~bulldozer~~ Canal Digger
50 - 60 cm deep on N.
Shallower on South

② Breccia - The same soil as that found on hill tops - the dividing line between ① and ② is very clear.

Breccia layer is uniform thickness - 35 cm on south

③ Clay - Dark gray - Soil chart - shading into blue the deeper we get.

of the Canal.

Adamsleaver. Suggests
widening ~~the~~ sounding 2
1.50 and taking it down
only to the bottom of level
2. which he begins to do

Later in afternoon Dr Tarato
and I widen the
TRIAL TRENCH 2, 1975
both the ~~North~~ West
and to East. It
~~seems to~~ extends to the
East, but ~~diminutes~~ the
density of tiles and stones
diminishes immediately
we extend the limits of
Trial Trench 2 1975. 1m.
to E. and decide to continue
~~the~~ it in this direction
on Monday.

The collection of stones and tiles
of late date (apparently)
strong belong to an ancient
debris.

S. Banks -

✓ June 5, 1975.

In area of deposit
of vases. found in 1974
Pizzica 1974. P 81 ~~f~~.
location plan p. 95.

We find a number
of vases, fragments,
including very fine
BG and some fine
two-faced ware which
may belong to vase
found last year.

These are located
on top of layer of

fist sized stones
and under a layer of
tiles, about 1 meter
below top of S. Bank.

In view of the
evidence that the
stratum of pottery,
roof tiles and stones
extends for quite a
distance along the
south bank, up
as far as the ~~the~~ layer
of tiles and stones found
in Trial Trench 2,
1974; it appears

as though the stream
has cut through
~~through~~ a uniform
layer of this material,
possibly of circular
shape

We decide to make
a cutting in the bank.
here to determine ^{how} far
the deposit extends
~~further south if~~
~~further~~

✓ June 6 -

Adams team suggest
a cut with Bulldozer
along S. Bank opposite
the large stone and
the deposit.

✓ June 9 - ~~ED~~

North Bank

Sounding 2 ~~extension~~
to the South, to the
East of ~~#~~ trial
Trench 1974 in which
stones and tile mass
uncovered.

Bulldozer takes
the bank down to
a level just above
the mass of stone
and tile. This is
approx. the level

at which statuettes
and vases were found.

The first battuta

In a trench 2.20

NS x 6.30 E W

takes the level down

~~to~~ 20 below the highest

of the stones in the

1974 trench. At

this point a number

of flakes appear - they

form a stratum

but not a thick one

Sounding 4 .

Layout trench

5m EW x 3m NS

Over the aligned field
stones found June 9th
(by De Taranto)

Uncovers an alignment
of tiles running in
roughly N-S direction
ca 30 cm wide

It proves to stretch
from the S. bank of the
ditch Southward about
3 x 10 m

The soil from this area is grey with tiles mixed in.

Material is all apparently Greek BG. ~~Plus~~ fine ware

N.B. Three fine BG. bases of cups

The material from the area of the stone wall is the same but kept separate

~~At a right angle~~,
~~a long~~ another alignment
of stones mixed with
tile. This ~~would~~
extends in E W
direction. Appears
to intersect at
right angles the
tile wall. The partial
ring of field stones found
June 10 ~~occupy~~
would occupy the corner

~~Fall~~

The original trench
is extended to the
South

to see if the wall
continues. The
extension measure
2.50 m E-W X
2.00 m N-S.

The wall does not
appear to continue though
there are several tiles
on the line - Perhaps

First Battuta

This material appears
to D'Andrea to be
Fourth Century - Third
Century B.C. - Notes
Gnathia Base.

Second Battuta

A layer of clay in
which very little
material appears

~~Some~~ In the floors
created by the battuta
material is visible

It appears that there
are two layers of material
separated by a layer
of clay. Same situation
as north bank. Second
battuta may have gotten
some material from the lower

Stonewall appears to
continue to East, many
~~rounded~~
smooth field stones
but not on a fine
The fall from ~~the wall~~
or some sort of reinforcement
~~The wall~~

There is a layer of
small stones and grey
a breccia, but not
like the one found on
the hilltop according
to D. Tarant.

Could it be the flying
coarse for the house

On outside, the N-S wall
to the west, and it
appears opposite the
EW Wall" in the
north bank of the Canal

Afternoon

De Parante Limestone
Wall Oriented NW

SE. Composed of
Squared blocks,
ca 30cm wide.

It runs from the S.
Bank, back into
wall of the bulldozer
cut - More earth must

be removed before its

Designated "Squared
Stone wall".

To differentiate it
from the first "wall"

Sounding 12

Cutting along N

Bank reveal two
distinct levels of
Breccia about
30 cm apart, separated
by a layer of brownish
grey sand in which there
is ~~not~~ no material

Associated with upper
level of Breccia is
material of 19th
Century Ditch (B Andri)

~~With the top~~
This upper level
appears to correspond

with the level of
the tile wall, ~~stone~~
wall

Just above the lower
level appears abundant
ceramic material (photos)
~~Spending D~~
Teller, Di Taranto
discovers stone wall
over this layer of
Breccia. Next to one
of the stones, a fragment
of the same (?) mid -

FIND - emblem with
the head of a satyr.

Cleaning in the
area of the squared
stone wall reveals -

intersecting NS Squared
stone wall. The corner
is just on the ~~thick~~
of the canal -

1.80 from the corner to
regular course of blocks
is interrupted by a
layer of tiles which
extends 1.00m
then the stone wall
returns for 80 cm
where it is again inter-
rupted by ~~floor~~
of small stones

SOUNDING over
Soundings A + B,
Continue the second

clay inside to brownish
grey outside, not so
sticky and with some
stones

to the east of the
stone. a "pit" -
With burned material
and much pottery
FIND. Bronze belt
buckle?

Second ballista encounter.
a level of small
pebbles - breccia
at 43 cm ~~62~~ below
the corner of the squared
stone wall. All levels
will be measured from
here

Below the level
of the breccia 12
cm. was found in
situ, and complete
a Ionic Cup.

The pavement of the
Fourcentury between
the Squared stone
walls is at -12 cm

thus the archaic level
is 43 cm below the
fourcent. one.

Another pavement
appears.

The level of the base
of the three stones on
N. bank, and the
lower level of breccia

filling the level
of the tiles is nearly
