





# Δ 1 Level 'I', Unit 3 "Room 1"

\* Have made a small test trench into the soil just south of the S. wall of "Room 1".

The soil just below the wall of "Room 1" is light tan - almost yellowish in color w/ a certain amount of reddish materials; The texture is very fine and somewhat clay. Below this level the soil is a gray color w/ a amount of reddish streaks. This lower level also is filled w/ many stones ranging from small pebbles to larger stones 0.05 - 0.17 m. A soil sample has been taken of both soils.



Only sherd found in test trench was a tile fragment 0.06m. max. l. which was orange in color. It was found approximately at the dividing point between the two soils. At the base of the test trench in the NW corner was some charcoal, but it was too small an amount to collect.

The layer of stones at the lowest level are concentrated quite heavily and may have been placed there by human hands.

Ruth has suggested that the upper level of soil may be a layer of sand put down during the construction of the wall.







I am excavating the interior of F.2. to try to determine its exact function. Level 1 in the Fireplace consisted of clay mixed w/ sand & charcoal fragments. The soil in A. ~~is~~ has a blacker hue than the other soil - blackness may be due to higher charcoal conc. Charcoal is very scattered mostly small lenses w/ some lumps. I have taken a charcoal sample + also a soil sample from area A. Several flat stones near the South wall appear to have fallen in from a position on that wall. The South wall of the Fireplace seems to be part of a wall of the structure while the East wall appears to abut on a cross wall. Level 1 of the Fireplace ranged from 0.09m. - 0.03m in depth w/ the deepest area being in the NE corner (A) + the majority of Fireplace c. 0.03m.

LEVEL TO BASE OF LEVEL 1 = - 1.85m. from stake N° 3 (-7.71)  
LEVEL 1 consists of soil down down to base of rocks in interior of Fireplace. In all of Fireplace 2 except A. soil was reached which was lighter gray in color w/ streaks of red (sand?). Area A. remained blacker in hue.

Cleaning of wall + tile fall (in M' - 2)

work started in M' - 2 (bordering  
onto N' - 2). purpose: to define walls +  
tile fall and their respective extent.  
procedure: to clean the covering  
tile layer carefully. The wall

structures seem to be packed with broken tiles in layers, and the outer edges are bonded with field stones. After many hours of clearing the extent of the walling running E-W became clear (wall A). It has throughout a width of 0.40 m. The <sup>exposed</sup> length from the stake at N<sup>1</sup>-3 (NW corner) is 2.65 m. South of the wall there was a one-layer tile fall. North of the wall the tile fall was deeper, with base bottoms and grey ware preserved in a 'pocket', more interesting handle  (Type: metal bucket). Relation between wall 5 (running N) and tile fall yet to be determined.

The skeleton found at the junction of room 1 & E in H1  
on the S1 has now been removed & cleaned below the  
area around it. The skeleton is in fairly good condition,  
in the flexed position with the head facing east.  
It appears from the pelvic bones to have been a  
woman. The femur is c. 40 inches long;  
no gifts were found except for 1 corroded iron  
nail + a few sherds.

The skeleton lies c. 10 cm from the tops of the  
walls. + next to left foot is in the wall.  
The skeleton is on its side with its hands  
bent towards its head.

The skeleton seems to have been placed ~~there~~  
~~there~~ on the floor? + then covered. However,  
the earth covering the skeleton did not appear  
different from the earth associated with this  
level, except perhaps that it was a little  
softer as one descended further.

There are possibly the bases of a border of  
small stones at the NE, however, at the S + to  
the wall E, there are tiles at the same level  
as the skeleton, in some cases even covering  
some bones - as in the lower tiles remain.

Does this imply that the tiles in this area  
were associated in any way with the body -  
as a cover, or that the tiles fell  
almost immediately after the body was  
placed because there is so little  
difference in levels between them?

Another question to be answered is how  
deep are the walls + does the skeleton lie  
in a pit or on a floor?

THE Pottery at M<sup>1</sup>-5 — In addition to the large skyphos frag. previously noted — a frag. of a smaller skyphos, a ~~red~~ frag. of pyxis or hydria, frag. of small, shallow black glaze bowl, a conical loomweight, an amphora handle, a pyxis lid, and numerous black glaze + coarseware frags. were found in this fall.
