



~~Some sherds mixed in with the tiles. Of interest: miniature leprosaria with cross pattern (top missing) inside wall A, along the southern edge, 0.25m from the W end (several photographs taken in situ).~~




Note statuette frags - esp. a very nice head from south of O^{1-6} , N^{1-6} - level 4. This is slightly unusual because most of the material from low statuette frags have come from the north east + central area + ne square.

N^{1-4} - Work begun to excavate area bounded by walls A, B, + 2. An area 1.00 x .85 has been opened. At a depth of 0.07 m. a worked stone 0.40 x 0.38, a small conglomerate stone c. 0.10 x 0.10, and several tiles were uncovered. The soil is extremely hard and contains many small stones + pebbles.



In this initial level pottery finds consisted of a few coarseware frags.

Work has begun on the extension of the N-S. trench of the 1976 season. One purpose of this excav. will be to correlate the levels of the 1976 trench w/ the 1977 trench. The work is being done in the area east of the N-S. trench.


N¹-4 In the area to the south of the worked stone (area c. 0.36×0.85) the level was taken down 0.20 w/in 0.12-0.14m. of level of wall 2. The soil was damper & thus easier to work w/in. A coarseware rim frag & small coarseware handle were only objects found in level once the few tiles at top of level had been removed. Soil contained very small stones in contrast w/ initial 0.07m.

Giuseppe has brought sterile soil to our attention. At present it is my understanding that this will not be excavated once the area has been leveled out. Due to disc. of sterile soil, new levels were taken nearer to the eastern boundary of the '76 N-S. fr. The level stick was kept approximately even w/ the -3 stakes.



EAST EXT. — Below the raised area of pebbles & tiles at the base of batt. 2 there was a large black stain which appeared to be the remains of one or several fairly large chunks of burnt wood (c. 1.60 x .30). The charcoal deposit consisted primarily of darkly stained soil, however there were some small lumps & lenses. There was a large number of rootlets in the deposit, and it was impossible to remove all of them at the site. The stain was approx. even w/ point B and extends downward into batt. 3. A SAMPLE HAS BEEN TAKEN.





There are indications that the wall is built of several layers of neatly placed tiles, with a surrounding tile layer at the SW end - the actual W. of the wall seems to be only 0.1 m and not m. as it appeared from the surface tile layer at the S end.

N.S. Trench E. EXT. — Chocolate soil (Nestles' choc. milk powder) plus burned area remain the most productive areas the yellowish-reddish soil (golden) is almost sterile for the most part. "Chocolate" soil extends southward fr. the burnt area & tapers towards the west





Finds once again are few in no. - 2 grayware frags., 3 terra sig. frags., some frag. of a "casserole" or mortar w/ scalloped applied handle & other coarseware frags.

The area of non-virgin soil is steadily increasing.

BATT 8 N.S.E. EXT I have found the frag. of a lamp in soil fr. this level thrown into wheelbarrow. Part of nozzle, side & top survives. Top appears to have had a figured design. Small rolled handle. Gray ware type clay. Appears to be Roman. May have come from north half but most likely from southern half.

BATT. 9 N. S. E. EXT. - EXCAVATED AREA HAS BEEN REDUCED TO A SLIVER OF NON-VIRGIN SOIL. THIS WILL BE THE LAST BATT OF THE E. EXT. THERE WAS NO NORTH HALF IN THIS LEVEL AS IT APPEARS TO BE ENTIRELY

UNDER THE BURN LAYER. Now THAT BATT. 9 has been taken out it appears that all of BATT 8. is also under the burnt level, certainly not much higher than the lowest extremity of burn level. Finds in Batt 9 were very few Coarseware w/a few grayware, a circular loomweight & one small black glaze sherd and some tiles w/ a greenish hue.

M¹-6 confusing but slow morning - bulldozer eating away dirt to the E of the trench. (including eastern edge of trench before I had time to draw the levels). Much time spent on chopping down the wheelbarrow ramp in the SE corner of the trench. One more bath tub throughout the trench and we should be down to the level of M¹-5. - (very few shards - one spindle whorl used as loom weight) wall & - continued cleaning of surface - outline of wall now clear. It remains to be seen what the blocks of roughly hewn stones along the W edge of the wall are doing there.

thin wall between and around all these
walls. Wall F can be defined clearly
only along the W edge, where it consists
of layers of pebbles and round
feldstones. However it's a distinct jumble
that it does not attach to the northern
edge of wall G'. Instead there is a
curved cover tile with one long and one
short edge preserved which is actually
below the level of the wall, at the
conjectured point of merging with G'.
Next to the cover tile is a cover tile placed
upside down, with a double S inscribed



For the past two days I have been clearing off the
"pavement" north of Room 1 in N'-31-4. The "pavement"
now appears to be nothing more than pebbles deposited
by a flood. This casts serious doubt the pavement of
Room 1. One primary reason for discarding the pavement
identification is the virtual lack of finds. Only very few
shards were found and all were small in size.
layer of stones seems to be present throughout stratigraphy,
however at this point that can not be stated w/ absolute
