Dr. Galbreath (Associate Professor, Northern Michigan University and Research Associate, University of New Mexico) is our collaborator on our "Collaborative Integrated Inventory of Biomes of the Arctic (CIIBA) Project in Mongolia. He is authorized to act as an agent of the Museum of Southwestern Biology in bringing preserved scientific mammalian specimens (including tissues and parasites) to the University of New Mexico in Albuquerque, New Mexico. These specimens were legally collected in Mongolia and have appropriate Museum of Southwestern Biology specimens tags affixed to them and you are authorized to bring them into the US. These specimens will enter the United States in compliance with appropriate federal, state and foreign laws, and through a non-designated port of entry (DEN - Colorado). Appropriate federal declaration forms, Non-designated port exception permit, and necessary foreign export permits are included in the already filed Edec. We have spoken with USFWS inspector Tracy Ellis in Denver and she is expecting his arrival on 9 September on United Airlines 138.
