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Loan Policy and Conditions

1. Loans are made to institutions, not individuals; therefore, specimens may not be moved to any other address without prior written permission from the AMNH.
2. Loans are to be returned before the loan's due date. Requests for extensions should be made in writing before this date. Written inquiries will be sent by the AMNH regarding loans held past their due date. Failure to respond to AMNH inquiries may result in restriction of borrower privileges including immediate termination of the loan, recall of all loaned specimens, and denial of subsequent requests.
3. Specimens being returned should be carefully packed in the same manner in which they were sent. All returns must be sent via UPS, FedEx, USPS, or similar carriers with tracking capability. Packages containing ethanol or other controlled chemicals must be packed and shipped in accordance with IATA regulations
4. Original specimen labels or tags may not be removed or altered in any way. Any suggested change(s) in specimen ID or associated data should be submitted in writing or noted on the AMNH invoice.
5. While on loan, specimens must be stored in accordance with accepted professional standards. Unless otherwise noted, fluid-preserved specimens are to be stored in 70% ethanol.
6. Loaned specimens may not be altered or dissected in any way without express written permission from the AMNH
7. Products of preparation are regarded as part of the specimen and must be returned to AMNH unless the loan agreement specifies otherwise.
8. Any publications resulting from examination of specimens included in this loan must acknowledge AMNH as the holder of the specimens and cite the AMNH catalog numbers. The borrower is asked to provide AMNH with copies of any publication(s) resulting in whole or in part from this loan. Digital files should be made available to AMNH; acceptance of such files is at the discretion of AMNH.
9. AMNH is not responsible for verifying specimen identifications. Efforts have been made to ensure the accuracy of information concerning identification, collecting locality, etc. but errors do exist. It is the borrower's responsibility to verify specimen identifications. AMNH is not responsible for any circumstance arising from misidentified specimens.
