Matt,

I just asked Derek who said yes. These specimens were found by Ian Bruce. Here is the email Ken wrote to him, dated March 28 2011:

"The three Euchloe specimens arrived. Their wings were oddly crumpled, so I put them in the relaxer, and yesterday I spread them. They'll spend a week on the spreading board, and then I'll photograph them and send the photos to some other people to confirm my first impression, which was that they are indeed Euchloe naina and thus a very important find.

If this beast is at all common at the spot and at the time when these were obtained, it would be great to obtain a real series of them this coming summer (or whenever they turn up). If you are able to do that, don't pin them--just put each specimen in a small envelope (I can send you some) and then mail them in a small rigid box.

The other thing that would be very useful would be a live closeup photo of the under side of one of these. Find one feeding on nectar or mud-puddling..."
