Hi Matt,

Criomorphus conspicuus Metcalf, 1923 and Criomorphus wilhelmi Anufriev & Averkin, 1982 are jr synonyms of Criomorphus inconspicuus (Uhler, 1877). This will be published in an upcoming manuscript (which has been delayed, but hopefully will see the light this summer).

The genus is seldom seen, so I think has been overdescribed; would love to see a long series to get a better feel for population-level variation. You have had better luck finding it than anyone else I know. I have not collected it myself; nor Steve Wilson, I think.
