Thanks for the quick reply to my request.

Good to see there is indeed a DNA barcode, seeing the quality of the moth...

Anyway, I can give you a final name for the list: it is a female Ectoedemia occultella lindquisti.

This is a Holarctic species, but for the time being we keep the North American as subspecies lindquisti.

There is no identified specimen yet on BOLD, but I have several sequences myself of the North American form, and they are identical.
