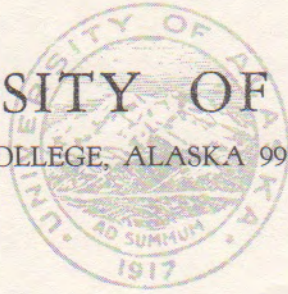

I received my copy of the picture presenting my parka to Dinah Wolfe today, and wish to say "thanks very much." Also I noted the item about it in the "Nanook News." These small measures of recognition go along way in conveying appreciation to donors of items to the museum.

In the interim, I've determined the origin and related details of the parka. I purchased it in 1959 from Elizabeth and David K. Nicolai of Kuetluk. The parka had been made for their daughter Elizabeth who was attending Mt Edgecumbe, but who declined to use it since it would be out of place at Edgecumbe. A definite legend accompanies the parka which may be available from the Nicolai's, or from Marty or Moses Nicolai. David K. is her father-in-law. Marty and Moses Nicolai were personal friends of mine while I was in Kuetluk, and will remember me and the parka.
