Deaf Link: Deaf Link continues to operate Shelter Link in the Auchan Shelter in Houston and the Galveston Shelter located at 53rd and Ave. N. for the persons who are deaf staying there. Information on recovery efforts and disaster recovery assistance programs are still being processed by AHAS and AHAS-IN for persons with disabilities from the affected areas who are enrolled in the program.

American Red Cross (ARC): The American Red Cross is operating 6 shelters with a population of 1,074. There are 79 vehicles providing feeding, served 84,905 meals, 3,408,784 meals have been served to-date. There are 2,050 disaster workers providing these services.

Public Utilities Commission (PUC): The only company that still has electric outage from Hurricane Ike is Centerpoint Energy. The company continues to restore power to customers who can receive electrical service. As of today, 2,200 customers remained without power.

Public Works Response Team (PWRT): San Antonio Water Systems (SAWS) resources are demobilizing from Galveston in stages this week with the last resources scheduled to leave Galveston on October 9, 2008.

City of Galveston has licensed electrical and licensed plumbing inspectors to assist in the restoration effort. PWRT deployed 19 resources from the Cities of Arlington, Austin, Benbrook, Burnet, Frisco, Hutchings, Killeen, Lago Vista, Montgomery, Temple, and Wichita Falls.

Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ): TCEQ Field Teams from Beaumont, Houston and Galveston have inspected 181 debris management sites along the coast. No changes to Public Water System (PWS) status report: TCEQ has assessed 1,384 PWS facilities in 10 counties that serve 7,135,078 people. All facilities have been contacted and their operational status assessed. TCEQ will continue monitoring and reporting the status of those facilities reported as non-operational.

Air Quality: Background levels of ozone and particulate matter (PM2.5) remained "Good". Only one site, Houston Clinton C403, reached "Moderate" for fine particulate. Air monitoring samples were taken at three locations - No health impacts are expected at the levels observed. Some of the samples did show levels at which unusually sensitive people, such as those with asthma, should consider limiting prolonged outdoor activity.

Beaumont Activities for 10/5/08 - Debris site teams visited 8 debris sites, contained and recovered 16 orphaned containers and tanks with the assistance of EPA contractors, surveyed and identified 25 orphaned containers and tanks for recovery in Chambers County, continued efforts to contact Public Water Supply entities and issued Boil Water Notices as needed.

Houston Activities for 10/5/08 - Hazardous Materials & orphaned containers survey and response/recovery, 8 recon teams, 8 removal/recovery teams, 1 team conducted monitoring for particulate matter using a portable instrument (E-BAM) in Fort Bend County, 3 teams addressed debris burning issues in Brazoria, Liberty and Montgomery Counties; investigated a burning complaint in Brazoria County, 6 teams visited 31 debris management sites to review waste receipt, segregation and disposal activities, 3 teams conducted storm surge residue sampling.

Galveston Activities for 10/5/08 - 6 teams conducted surveys of orphaned containers for final removal on the Bolivar Peninsula and Intracoastal Waterway, 7 teams recovered/removed 148 orphan containers, with total removed to date of 4,122, 1 Emergency Response team conducted recon sweep of the City of Galveston for spills and hazardous materials, 2 teams performed recon missions of debris management sites in Galveston and Chambers counties.

Texas Department of Family and Protective Services (DFPS): Essential services continue to be provided to Galveston through work from/out of the nearby Texas City office and remote site trailer on Galveston Island. Currently, DFPS has four offices that are closed, two in Galveston and two in Harris County.

Texas Department of Assistive and Rehabilitative Services (DARS): Significant restoration work continues to be done at the Alvin DRS Office and minor restoration work is continuing to be done at the Galveston DRS. The Galveston DRS field office has opened for business.

The following DARS Division for Rehabilitation Service (DRS) offices are closed until further notice: Alvin DRS; Galveston DRS; Galveston Transitional Learning Community DRS; and Liberty DRS. Galveston TLC employees are serving customers out of the Galveston DRS office.

Texas Health and Human Services Commission (HHSC): HHSC continues to coordinate the delivery of ice and water to support pods and feeding kitchens. HHSC has hired and will continue to hire staff for the Other Needs Assistance Disaster grant program. HHSC is currently staffing all the DRC's at this time. HHSC has processed 15,226 people for ONA grants with the amount totaling \$24,703,450.80 for losses due to Hurricane Ike.

Texas Department of Insurance (TDI): Texas Department of Insurance (TDI) staff is providing insurance assistance at Disaster Recovery Centers. TDI has issued several bulletins to the insurance industry relating to Hurricane Ike. The TDI Hurricane Ike resource page now includes a consumer alert regarding contractors and repairing or rebuilding one's home. That web page also contains information regarding the TDI bulletins, FEMA payments, the National Flood Insurance Program, claim forms for the Texas Windstorm Insurance Association (TWIA) and the Texas FAIR Plan, safety tips for consumers. In addition, TDI's toll-free Consumer Help Line (1-800-252-3439) is maintaining extended hours, operating Monday – Saturday 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. and Sunday 1 to 6 p.m. TDI encourages consumers to be alert to all forms of insurance fraud; report insurance fraud toll-free by calling 888-327-8818. TDI has updated its Hurricane Ike Consumer Resource Page on its website at http://www.tdi.state.tx.us/consumer/storms/cpmhurrike.html

Texas Procurement & Support Services (TPASS): TPASS is receiving demobilization requests from Texas Forest Service, Texas Military Forces and the American Red Cross Kitchens. TPASS continues processing requests for needed services and equipment.

Texas Department of Transportation (TXDOT): TXDOT is in the process of removing debris from highway rights of way. TXDOT continues to inspect roads and bridges for damage assessments and monitor road conditions throughout the affected areas. Road conditions continue to be updated on the TXDOT Web site. TXDOT is replacing damaged/missing signs, signals and their supports.

Texas General Land Office (GLO): Coastal Resources staff will continue assisting the City of Galveston and Galveston County with emergency permitting issues. Coastal Resources will also continue to assist Brazoria County with emergency permitting and other issues that may arise. Coastal Resources staff continues to work with DEM and FEMA concerning issues associated with debris removal and will be coordinating a conference call to discuss contracting issues.

Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD): TPWD has completed all search and rescue and recovery operations. Region 4 Houston is continuing marine patrols in Galveston and Bolivar peninsula areas and local game wardens continue to assist local jurisdictions on request.

Texas Engineering and Extension Service (TEEX) (Texas Task Force 1): Texas Task Force One completed search and recovery operations and have demobilized as of 1700 on 6 October 2008.

Texas Office of Attorney General (OAG): The OAG Operation Safe Shelter (OSS) Hotline has queried 12,458 names through the Texas Department of Public Safety Sex Offender Registration Database. Of those names, 32 were confirmed Sex Offenders (matches). OSS continues to operate and is receiving updated sheltering list from the American Red Cross daily.

Texas Department of Housing & Community Affairs (TDHCA): TDHCA is working with FEMA and GDEM to manage transitional housing issues. TDHCA personnel continue to staff the FEMA Joint Field Office. Hurricane housing resources for individuals and communities are on the agency's website. Community action agencies within the affected counties are assisting hurricane-affected citizens. Information is ready for local communities regarding possible post-disaster housing assistance and TDHCA will provide any technical assistance necessary to help applicable communities apply for post-disaster housing funds.

Texas Workforce Commission (TWC): Two workforce centers remain closed one in Liberty and one in Orange. A temporary workforce center site was established in Liberty County (Dayton, First United Methodist Church Fellowship Hall, 106 S. Cleveland St., Davton, TX 77535.) Mobile Workforce Units are located in Orange and Bridge City. Workforce Board/Center staff is located at all established DRCs and continue to assist in shelters with significant numbers of evacuees. UI continues to coordinate with Boards to place UI staff to assist with taking DUA/UI claims in the locations where there is the most demand for service. The dedicated lines {UI Life Line} for customers coming to Gulf Coast -Hobby office to file their UI/DUA claims has been expanded to high volume areas and is working out very well. TWC has taken approximately 147,857 claims. (49,487 regular initial claims; 78,938 regular initial claims where the separation was listed as disaster impacted; 9,935 EUC initial claims and 9,401 DUA initial claims). The Department of Labor has approved Texas' request for \$15.9 million, with an initial award of \$7.95 million available now. Contract development is in process for distribution of the initial \$7.9 million in Board areas affected by Ike. The pre-Award letter authorizes Boards to incur expenditures from September 7, 2008 (the effective date of the NOO) through October 31, 2008. Total recovery and cleanup jobs entered by TWC state staff, local staff, and/or employers are 117 postings with 598 openings. To date we have referred 6662 clients and have posted 117 hires. The Texas Workforce Commission wants you to know you may be eligible for disaster-related unemployment benefits. Individuals who are self-employed also may be eligible for disaster-related

Baptist Child and Family Services (BCFS): BCFS has accepted all MSN guests from throughout the state. BCFS is currently operating 5 MSN units on the campus of TCID and the San Antonio State Hospital. BCFS case managers are working with all guests with an effort to return guests home when possible. As guests are identified around the state as needing MSN sheltering the DSHS MACC is coordinating with BCFS for placement into our long term shelters.

Texas Department State Health Services (DSHS): DSHS continues to provide assistance to State, regional, and local jurisdictions to meet their public health needs. DSHS Multi-agency Coordinating Center (MACC) is now staffed with a recovery team that continues to work repatriation requests as they come in and continue to work with Galveston County Health District and American Red Cross to resolve medical special needs (MSN) needs in Galveston.

Galveston ARC Shelter has just over 470 general population evacuees and 7 MSN's.

MSN operations in San Antonio, provided by Baptist Children and Family Services, continue for 95 evacuees at the Texas Center for Infectious Disease and the San Antonio State Hospital. The plan to increase medical assets for UTMB is ongoing.

Houston Area Hospitals and Dialysis Centers operations are ongoing.

Disaster Behavioral Health (DBH) and Critical Incident Stress Management is ongoing. Operations continue for Finance, Vaccine, Applied Public Health Team, MACC Safety and Media Inquiry.

DSHS MSN Patient Call Locator Center: Received 618 calls to date as of 10-7-08 1700 hours. The call center has moved to the MACC.

Texas Forest Service (TFS): Twelve members of the Texas Forest Service Lone Star State Incident Management Team along with members from Regional Type 3 IMT's continue to work with the National Capital Region IMT from the Washington DC area to manage the Mass Care Base Camp for 500 volunteers providing support to workers and residents in Galveston following Hurricane Ike. The Base Camp operations are scheduled to conclude on 8 October 2008. The National Capitol Region IMT, who are on an EMAC order will return their delegation of authority back to TFS at 1800 on Oct 7th and return to their Home Station on Wednesday. The Lone Star State IMT will demobilize on Thursday morning and transfer remaining base camp area to TCEQ. TFS EOC in College Station continues to provide support to TFS personnel still deployed. All other hurricane response missions assigned to TFS have been completed.

Galveston County: Two PODs remaining in Galveston County (1 in High Island & 1 in Crystal Beach).

Texas Taskforce Ike DDC: Curfews remain in effect in the City of Galveston from 2000 to 0600. Public water, sewer and electrical utilities are still limited. A boil water notice is also still in effect until further notice. Sections of the city with partially restored water systems have not been cleared for potable water use. Sewer systems are partially functional in some areas due to the installation of temporary bypass pump stations. UTMB remains at a low level of operation with only minimal use of the emergency room. Critical care patients are being flown via helicopter off the island. Electricity is on to all but approximately 4,600 homes. There has also been a reported increase in structure fires on the island.
