Deaf Link: Deaf Link continues to operate Shelter Link in the Auchan Shelter in Houston and the Galveston Shelter. Both locations continue to operate using aircards for internet access. Severe weather alerts and updates to boil water notices continue to be processed by AHAS and AHAS-IN for persons with disabilities from the affected areas who are enrolled in the program. The Houston Disaster Recovery Center is now Deaf Link Accessible for persons who are deaf and needing to apply for assistance.

American Red Cross (ARC): The American Red Cross is operating 6 shelters with a population of 999. There are 79 vehicles providing feeding, served 84,905 meals, 3,408,784 meals have been served to-date. There are 2,050 disaster workers providing these services.

Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ): To date 1,351 facilities for 99.5% of population served are reported as operational and 33 facilities for 0.5% of population served are reported as non-operational. TCEQ will continue monitoring and reporting the status of those facilities reported as non-operational.

Status update on City of Port Arthur WWTP (Sabine Pass Plant) - City is still working on getting the plant online. They are still rebuilding the air heater system, replacing weirs and baffles in the clarifier, rebuilding the outfall piping, and still working on the electrical system. Currently the sewage is being pumped from lift Stations to frac tanks and hauled to Port Arthur.

Air Quality - Yesterday, ozone stayed in the "Good" range in Houston and Beaumont. Particulate Matter (PM2.5) was in the lower end of the "Moderate" range in the Conroe area downwind of Houston. Today, Houston and Beaumont are expected to remain in the "Good" range for ozone and PM2.5. Tomorrow, ozone and PM2.5 should stay in the "Good" range across all of southeast Texas.

Mobile Monitoring - The team observed evidence of small burns but did not encounter any active fires. Several waste managers indicated that they had made plans for alternative waste management (chipping, hauling, etc) after attempts at burning had resulted in complaints from neighbors. No readings in excess of ambient air standards were observed.

Beaumont Activities October 13, 2008, with Utah Civil Support Team: Investigated 2 of 43 debris management sites; contained and recovered 18 orphaned containers and tanks with the assistance of EPA contractors; identified 3 orphaned containers and tanks for recovery in Chamber County.

Houston Activities October 13, 2008: six teams hazardous materials and orphaned containers recovery, coordinated with Pasadena Joint Incident Command; two teams conducted particulate matter monitoring in Chambers and Galveston Counties; conducted investigations in response to 2 burning related complaints, one each in Brazoria and Montgomery; three investigation teams addressed debris burning issues in Liberty, Montgomery, Fort Bend, Wharton, and Brazoria Counties; twelve teams conducted 17 debris management (TDSRS) site visits; four teams assessed 11 public water supply sites; five teams assessed 28 wastewater treatment sites.

Galveston (Charlie Sector) Activities October 13, 2008: three teams conducted recovery operations of identified orphan containers in areas C-1, C-3, C-4 and C-5 of Bolivar Peninsula. 166 containers were removed. Total containers removed to date 6510.

One team conducted inspection activities on Galveston Island debris management staging area. One emergency response team responded to hazardous materials spills and emergency response calls as needed.

Texas Department of Family and Protective Services (DFPS): Essential services continue to be provided to Galveston from the Texas City office and remote site trailer on Galveston Island. Currently, DFPS has four offices that are closed, two in Galveston and two in Harris County.

Texas Health and Human Services Commission (HHSC): HHSC continues to coordinate the delivery of ice and water to support PODs and feeding kitchens. HHSC has hired and will continue to hire staff for the Other Needs Assistance Disaster grant program. HHSC is currently staffing all DRC's.

Texas Department of Insurance (TDI): Texas Department of Insurance (TDI) staff is providing insurance assistance at Disaster Recovery Centers. TDI has issued several bulletins to the insurance industry relating to Hurricane Ike. The TDI Hurricane Ike resource page now includes a consumer alert regarding contractors and repairing or rebuilding one's home. That web page also contains information regarding the TDI bulletins, FEMA payments, the National Flood Insurance Program, claim forms for the Texas Windstorm Insurance Association (TWIA) and the Texas FAIR Plan, safety tips for consumers. In addition, TDI's toll-free Consumer Help Line (1-800-252-3439) is maintaining extended hours, operating Monday – Friday 8 a.m. to 7 p.m., Saturday 10 a.m. to 7 p.m., and Sunday 1 to 6 p.m. TDI encourages consumers to be alert to all forms of insurance fraud; report insurance fraud toll-free by calling 888-327-8818. TDI has updated its Hurricane Ike Consumer Resource Page on its website at: http://www.tdi.state.tx.us/consumer/storms/cpmhurrike.html

Texas Procurement & Support Services (TPASS): TPASS continues to support the remaining ARC Kitchens and the Base Camp on Galveston Island. TPASS will keep the large tent on site until further notice along with portable toilets, hand washing stations, laundry services, shower units and light towers.

Texas Department of Transportation (TXDOT): TXDOT is in the process of removing debris from highway rights of way. TXDOT continues to inspect roads and bridges for damage assessments and monitor road conditions throughout the affected areas. Road conditions continue to be updated on the TXDOT Web site. TXDOT is replacing damaged/missing signs, signals and their supports.

Texas General Land Office (GLO): GLO met with Galveston County yesterday and is meeting with Jefferson County today to discuss Bolivar Peninsula recovery issues. GLO is working with the City of

Galveston and Galveston County regarding delivery of stockpiled sand to beaches as well as assisting with their FEMA site visits to determine what debris is reimbursable. GLO is obtaining cost estimates for debris removal in the bay systems in all impacted counties. Surveyors planning work to locate elevation lines and bench mark locations in the Bolivar area. GLO is conducting shoreline assessments of houses and structures along the beach in Galveston and Surfside. GLO contracts finalized to conduct aerial photography of the coastline in the impacted counties.

Texas Office of Attorney General (OAG): The OAG Operation Safe Shelter (OSS) Hotline has queried 12,860 names through the Texas Department of Public Safety Sex Offender Registration Database. Of those names, 31 were confirmed Sex Offenders (matches). OSS continues to operate and is receiving updated sheltering list from the American Red Cross daily.

Texas Department of Housing & Community Affairs (TDHCA): TDHCA is working with FEMA and GDEM to manage transitional housing issues. TDHCA personnel continue to staff the FEMA Joint Field Office for key meetings. Hurricane housing resources for individuals and communities are on the agency's website. Community action agencies within the affected counties are assisting hurricane-affected citizens. Information is ready for local communities regarding possible post-disaster housing assistance and TDHCA will provide any technical assistance necessary to help applicable communities apply for post-disaster housing funds

Texas Workforce Commission (TWC): The Liberty workforce center remains closed. A temporary workforce center site was established in Liberty County (Dayton, First United Methodist Church Fellowship Hall, 106 S. Cleveland St., Dayton, TX 77535.) Mobile Workforce Units are located in Orange and Bridge City. Workforce Boards are making decisions about whether to dedicate staff to a DRC/MDRC location based on traffic volume in those locations. Often, FEMA is advising on whether there is sufficient volume to warrant staff being located on site. Staff will continue to assist as needed. In addition to the DRCs and MDRCs, all workforce centers are open and anyone may visit our centers to request assistance with UI/DUA filing online or with job search opportunities. The dedicated lines {UI Life Line) for customers coming to Gulf Coast -Hobby and Texas City offices to file their UI/DUA claims has been expanded to high volume areas and is working very well. TWC has taken approximately 186,235 claims. (71,155 regular initial claims; 90,212 regular initial claims where the separation was listed as disaster impacted; 13,592 EUC initial claims and 11,276 DUA initial claims). Unemployment Insurance Support Services (UISS) field staff assisted Representative Sylvester Turner in an organized Town Hall Meeting 10/13/08. Staff from Workforce Solutions (Gulf Coast) were available to provide information about applying for UI/DUA claims and workforce services that are available. Computers were be available for constituents wanting to file UI/DUA claims online. Public Works Response Team (PWRT): Demobilized six inspector resources from the cities of Arlington, Austin, Burnet and Temple from plumbing and electrical inspection work in Galveston. There remain 15 inspectors from 7 cities working in Galveston. PWRT has provided the City of Orange contractor and engineering resource sources to assist with storm water drainage system inspections and debris clearance.

Baptist Child and Family Services (BCFS): BCFS has accepted all MSN guests from throughout the state. We are currently operating 3 MSN units on the campus of TCID and the San Antonio State Hospital, Bldg 528, Medical Center MC2 and MC4. BCFS case managers are working with all guests with an effort to return guests home when possible. As guests are identified around the state as needing MSN sheltering the DSHS MACC is coordinating with BCFS for placement into our long term shelters.

Texas Department State Health Services (DSHS): Galveston ARC Shelter had a census of 430 on Monday night; the total number of individuals registered in the shelter was 1108. Case managers continue to work with DADS, local officials, and area nursing homes to find transitional or permanent placement.

MSN operations in San Antonio, provided by Baptist Children and Family Services, continue for 80 evacuees at the Texas Center for Infectious Disease and the San Antonio State Hospital; 2 of the 80 are in hospital; 0 individuals were discharged on 10/13/08; 4 individuals were discharged on 10/14/08.

Texas Department State Health Services (DSHS): As of 1700 hours today, DSHS Multi-agency Coordinating Center (MACC), including the call center, will stand down. DSHS will continue to work repatriation requests as they come in and continue to work with Galveston County Health District and American Red Cross to resolve medical special needs (MSN) needs in Galveston. DSHS will continue to provide assistance to State, regional, and local jurisdictions to meet their public health needs. All partners can continue to use the contact information previously used to reach the recovery staff at DSHS moving forward.

DSHS MSN Patient Call Locator Center: Processed 626 cases to date as of 10-14-08 1300 hours. The call center is operating out of the MACC.

Disaster Behavioral Health (DBH) and Critical Incident Stress Management is ongoing.

Texas Forest Service (TFS): Four members of the Texas Forest Service Lone Star State Incident Management Team continue to manage the Mass Care Base Camp for volunteers providing support to workers and residents in Galveston following Hurricane Ike. Two firefighters are providing fire suppression dozer support to Chambers County at the request of the County EOC. Two employees are assigned to finance tracking.

The Governor's Division of Emergency Management is monitoring the situation and will issue additional reports as necessary. The SOC is at Level I (Emergency Conditions) to support Hurricane Ike recovery operations.

The four levels of SOC activation are:

Level I (Emergency Conditions)

Level II (Escalated Response Conditions)
Level III (Increased Readiness Conditions)

Level IV (Normal Conditions)
