There are two possibilities: the first is that we  
~~was~~ missed the top/definition of ~~the~~ trench <sup>and</sup> stopped  
when we located the black ashly layer (0755)<sup>2</sup>, the  
other is that 0755 does not extend into the newest section.

There may be a layer ~~of plaster~~ in the trench  
that is full of plaster and flecks of charcoal N/NE  
area of the unit. There is certainly a concentration of  
plaster and many 1/4 - 1/2 cm flecks of charcoal.

We were having some problems reconciling the wall trench <sup>(13)</sup> that ran down the NE part of the unit, adjacent to wall 0265 AND now most importantly wall 50. In retrospect, one problem was that we had too many people ~~at~~ working @ once in the 'wall trench', how we believe it to be wall trenches. First I came down to the above mentioned plaster & charcoal layer. Then Olga identified another surface / change in composition and color (?) under what was thought to be wall trench 0762. After cleaning the entire length of the unit along the walls Olga also identified a cut, for a short while she suspected it of being a pit. However, she could not find the southern-most cut as it extended all

photos, spot heights . . . as Context 0762 these had to be changed and given a new context # (0804). The lower layer, actually being 0762, will be recorded as such. We also decided to give the plaster and charcoal layer its own context number (0805). While talking with Gordana she noted the existence of Z-walks, not one, running the length of the unit; something that I hadn't noticed up until now. The lights went on and we now believe there are actually two wall trenches.

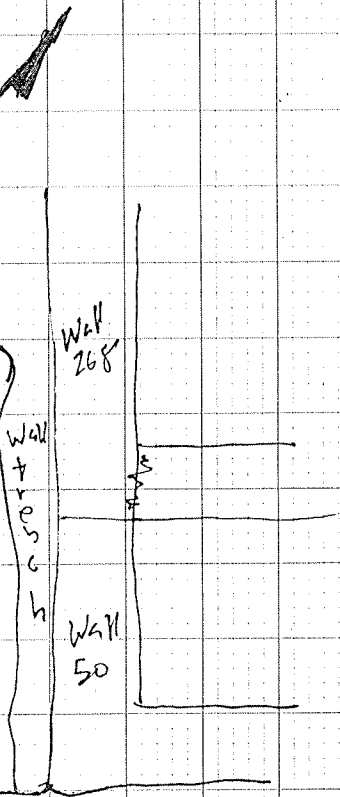

As we pulled back context 757 it began to give towards the center of the unit, between the well and section 2. We located a sharp edge/border \* SF.3654 bronze wire / context 0757 in cut of pit \* that appears to be a cut. However the contents of the cut look just like context 0757. The only difference is a couple of concentrations of ash and large bones. Flecks of charcoal - 5-1 cm in diameter were found both outside + inside the cut.

Area 3 has started to get complicated (imagine that), we have just about removed OS09 and there are @ least 3 contexts under it. A very dark almost black ashly semi-circular <sup>(actually irregular in shape)</sup> shaped soil, a grey ashly soil <sup>that</sup> irregularly in shape and brown soil over) the rest of Area 3 (besides the hearth/oven adjacent to wall 296). There was little or no hard boundary between 0752 and OS09. Adam suggests that the two may represent the same surface (relatively so to speak)

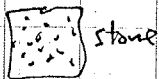
At the end of yesterday, we again changed the soil on the gravelly brown between the cistern and the hearth/oven. For ~~some~~ a while we believed it to be the same as 0759, but after removing the rest of 0759 in the N part of Area 3 we feel confident that 0883 is different.

0883 has what looks like rodent burrows and in general looks very disturbed. There are many large pieces of bone, the ceramics range from large to small in size and there is alot of tile also. There have been some slag recoveries including what may be hearth bottoms. There are certainly fewer hearth bottoms in 0883 ~~than~~ than 0899 (and other metalworking associated contexts).

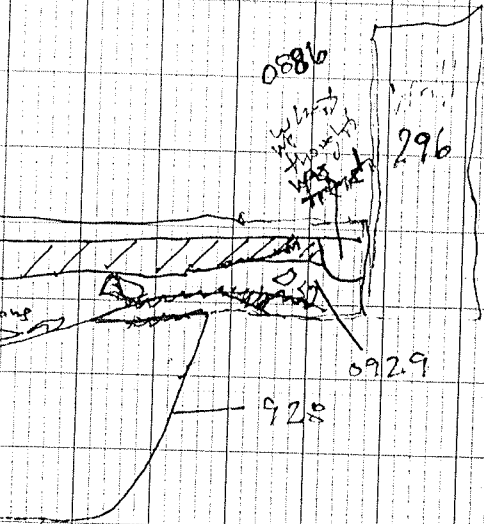

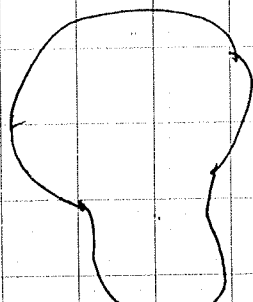
