- UA73-46-laj Shaman's necklace: (Identified by Dr. Schalef as such and a very similar necklace is illustrated in De Laguna's The Yakutat Tlingit, Vol. III, page 1090) Doubled rawhide loop approx. 24" long, with a small section at the top running twice through a 3 3/4" long bird bone used as a drinking tube (?Y- then a knot with larger loop with six pieces of bone ranging from 10 3/" long to 9 3/4" and three pieces of ivory ranging from 8 1/4" to 6 1/8" strung on hide: incising on bones, some of it stained red.
 - -2 Spoon of Dall sheep horn; tan color; handle pointed; three growth rings visible in bowl, four on other side; no designs 10" long.
 - -3 Spoon of Dall sheep horn; dark tan (oil stain); growth rings visible; handle pointed; some checking on bottom of bowl; no designs; twenty or so tiny gouges on inside of sppon bowl; 10 1/8" long.

File marks visible on backs of both spoons.
