## Trip Summary

Attyan Gorge 2021

Purpose: A discovery of a partial

Troosie fish skull was made by

a Toolik Field Station

employee, Jason Dembowski (of

Mich, S.I.U.?). He sent photos

to Maxine van der (DGS) to return

to me. I determined fossils

located in AMUR - USFS.

I got permit + use and ready

to collect. In other fm.

On Aug 14, Kevin May (USF-VAM)

Lisa Drockenmiller + myself

headed to Galbraith Lake via

USF vehicle. Arrived ~ 1700,

Set up camp by grazing @

Galbraith.

Aug 15, 2021.

Weather forecast poor (rain,

snow) so we decided not to

backpack into site, ~ 3 mi.

Return, we decided to stay  
in the light pecks so we  
could carry out as much as  
possible. This was a good  
decision.

~ 9:00 we hit the ground

Delta trying to sit along north  
side of river. Until now the  
weather was good - no rain,  
moderate wind, no bugs!

Took ~ 2 hrs to do lake.

Arrived at first outcrops (Permian)

& looked around - not much.

Concretions common. Lisa found  
part of weird mollusk fossil -  
(see field number earlier).

We then continued at Triassic  
reefs. These are prominent  
along north side of river. The  
find was made in a ex situ  
concretion of the Otter Run  
directly across river from  
creek draining the waterfall  
creek on south side of gorge.

The fossils were obvious when  
descended. We quickly looked  
around and then looked slightly  
down river to a prominent  
barbar & collected more  
Greg's 14<sup>th</sup> on top. See field #15,  
& GPS previously. Lisa filled  
peck with  $\leftarrow$  several specimens.

Delia had weather appropriate  
(as promised.) Quickly went  
back to the main Fish Skull  
& looked it up along with  
a few other blocks. Now weather  
hits. KM, LD & myself are  
in rain gear & loaded down with  
as much as we can carry  
(or more), what follows is  
The largest, heaviest load of rock  
I ever carried. Each takes their  
own preferred route back. I  
go via - skip for ~ 2-3 hrs until  
reaching road.  $\pm$  hurt. It's also  
cold & rainy (~ 45°F).

I drop pack @ home to go  
get car. Pick up my pack  
Then Lisa's. Nearly hypothermic.  
Warm up. Then hike back to  
check on RM - he is ok.  
Wait for him to reach  
Pipeline, pick him up & then  
hike back to camp.  
Chairing to dinner. Wet, 3rd  
warm up & change. Good  
night. Then bed.

Aug 16 2021

Slept in. Temp 35-40°F.  
Raining. Misty. After yesterday  
we decide we are done this  
trip. Good vehicle (& fossils)  
& head for Fairbanks. Lunch  
& cold foot. Arrive noon  
in Fairbanks. Rained entire  
drive home. Snow @ Atglen  
Pass. Arrive home with a  
great load of Triassic fossils!
